Sub Group Update SAFE AND ACCESSIBLE HOMES from David Biddle

David shared an easy read report. There is Housing Co-Production work going on. To find out what housing people want in the future. Disability Positive are running focus groups.

Jackie Goldstraw talked about a rent issue. When a year has 53 weeks in it instead of 52, universal credit do not pay the rent for the extra week. Weaver Vale sent everyone affected a message saying they owed money without explaining why. This was very stressful for the person it happened to. Jackie suggested an easy read letter should be sent out before it happens again explaining everything.

David said he would speak to colleagues in housing.

99 people are being supported.

We link different groups together and help find and share easy read information and useful links and get feedback.

Since the last meeting we shared information including cancer resources, government news, general election and voting links, Positive News and the Museums and Libraries Consultation.

Our social groups are for anyone aged over 16. The Winsford Friendship Group made displays for the Town Park and Saint Andrews Church for Brain Tumour, Colon, Prostate, Ovarian, Bowel and Testicular Cancer Awareness. As well as for World Purple Day for Epilepsy and Autism Awareness Month and National Tea Drinking Day on 21 April!













Our Winsford drama group is working on our murder mystery play. All of us might not survive!

And our Northwich Grub Club and Winsford Singing Group and new Books Beyond Words Book Club in Northwich are going well.

The Chester Singing Group is going well at the Den in Storyhouse. And the Chester Yarn Crafts Group have done more work on cancer awareness. A group member made a sign at woodwork for our display at Dial House with easy read cancer resources for people to read or take home.

The Chester **Games night** had two new members and Uno is the most popular game!

60 people watched Kung Fu Panda at the last Cinema and Review Club and a couple of groups stayed for the review afterwards.

The **Drumming and Sound Session at Live!** is a lovely group, everyone enjoys the drumming with a bit of movement and a relaxation session to end.

From end of April the monthly Cancer Awareness sessions with the Snack and Chat group at the Salvation Army in Ellesmere Port will carry on. The Food Security project we have been working on from January has been a great introduction for this group. Food is a big part in our health.

We have been finding out about the food choices people make and why. We worked with Community Baking at the Wesley Church and All About Greens and hosted 4 cooking and eating sessions to provide a supportive space for people to share meals and learn cooking skills. We listened to those struggling with food and have a better understanding of their challenges.















We have made recommendations for improving financial support and food security for adults with learning disabilities and autism. We hope this is just the start.

Our working group has given feedback on the Museums and Libraries Consultation. And the Housing Strategy and Council Self-Assessment.

And we met again at Speak Up Speak Out in Macclesfield. To talk about our thoughts about starting to be trained as Oliver McGowan trainers. Jackie also met with Pathways about being part of their Easy Read Partnership. And has done training on mental health, Trans Support and Volunteer Boundaries. And attended a virtual conference about Profound Multiple Learning Disabilities services. And started a new group for late diagnosed Neurodivergent adults.

And we worked on the easy read Partnership Board minutes, actions and difficult words. And the Easy Read presentation on Adult Social Care.

Canal Street Advocacy Group

From Penny Scott, Jan Hutcheson, Michael Gentle and Karen Bunnagar.

The group enjoyed a Pizza and breadmaking session and a healthy eating session with Ali. The Quality Monitoring Project will start again. Sarah the Community Safety Warden organised a visit to the Town Hall CCTV control room. There is a Hawaiian Day fundraiser on 1 May. They had a visit from Leanne to talk about sexual health.















Peoples Choice Group showed a presentation made by Suso. Suso means Speak Up Speak Out. They are a charity from Macclesfield that support people with learning disabilities and or autism.

This training is about the sad story of a young man who died because medical staff did not listen. His mum campaigned and now all health and social care staff have to get training about autism and learning disabilities.

The training is important so the same mistakes are not repeated. Oliver was let down by health care staff. He lost his life. His family lost their son. No-one else should go through that. People with learning disabilities and autistic people do sometimes die before they should. Services need to be better and all staff need to listen.

There is an e-learning part to the training. And another part delivered by people with a learning disability and autistic people. Either on a webinar or face to face. Some of the Peoples Choice Group are being trained to be trainers.

Jess, Gemma, Martin and Tom shared their thoughts and experiences.

The training is more powerful and memorable, coming from people who have lived experience.

Councillor Sheila Little asked if there is a list of who have been trained.



All staff in Health and Social care will have it but it is only just starting to be available.

If we get things right for people with learning disabilities and autistic people services will work better for everyone. Alistair thanked everyone for sharing their story.



Sub Group Update ADULT SOCIAL CARE STRATEGY CONSULTATION from Charlotte Walton and Natalie Abraham









Charlotte and Natalie spoke about the Adult Social Care Strategy Consultation. It is about Adult Social Care Services over the next 4 years. It is a short document about the way we work. Other documents have more detail. It was made by talking to lots of different people.

The Council want to know what is important to people so they can get Adult Social Care Services right.

Thank you to Peoples Choice Group for doing an easy read presentation.

They asked what everyone thought of the words used. The name of it is **Enabling Great Lives**.

Gemma suggested Supporting people to be independent.

Michael said he was worried about his choice being taken away of where he lives. Charlotte said that will not happen.















Jackie said Choice should be in the title. And that Strategy and Enable are difficult words. An explanation could be 'Our plan to support people to live life the way they choose'.

Lucy said Michael was right and choice is very important. She asked if the plan also was for young people who are moving into adult services. Charlotte said yes.

Charlotte said that good local communities help people have a great life. Karen said at a carers meeting people felt the plan did not mention people with complex health needs.

Charlotte said they want to get the language right. Not everyone can be fully independent, some people need support. Some people have short term care needs like after a fall. And some people have long term conditions. Everyone should feel included.

Pauline said Transport is a big issue. Not being able to get to places stops people doing things as well as money.

And when mid Cheshire College in Hartford closed a lot of people missed having local education choices.

Peoples Choice Group do a lot and it makes a massive difference to lives.

There are groups out there - Livewell Website and the WhatsOn Bulletin have details.

Gemma and Karen Bunnagar agreed that not having Transport stops them doing things. Online things are not the same. Community Transport only goes to certain areas and a certain distance. Natalie said lots of people are saying transport is an issue.

Live Well Cheshire West













Gemma Baxter said Transport is the least used part of the Livewell website. They want to put all transport options in one place – information is a big part of having control.

Alistair said Community Transport do what they can but more flexible transport is needed. They have regular meetings but are struggling. Money is a problem.

Charlotte said money is an issue for the Council. They are having to fight to get funding.

People said going out at night is a problem. Because of transport, staff changes, having to go home to take medication, and not having enough staff.

They have a section about Goals. To work as a team to improve services in peoples homes and the community.

People agreed there are good and bad carers. And low wages do not attract the best staff. Alistair said they are trying to recruit and give staff the right training to give quality care. Caring needs to be a more valued. There are signs things are getting better.

Peoples said they want the council to

- Listen and give people the person centred support they want.
- Give more support to carers.
- Give funding to local organisations to provide services.

Everyone agreed. The Council said **they will**

• Listen and work with people, help them make their own choices.



Sub Group Update LEARNING DISABILITY DAY SERVICES REVIEW from Alistair Jeffs



Alistair said hundreds of people have said what they think in workshops. And people can send in their comments until 8 May.

After the Consultation is finished the council will make a plan and share it. And make an Action Plan for each year so people can make sure they do what they said in the plan.

Lucy Kennerly said the Parent Carer Forum survey results will be presented on 22 May at Ellesmere Port Holiday Inn. They support younger families up to the age of 25.
