
WELCOME

Jan said **Day services are very important** to me. I see my friends and it makes me happy.




I go out to Advocacy Group meetings and speak up for others and represent them. The group has talked about the Consultation. I know a lot of people, and can contact them if needed.

All the people who had used the Willows Pool have alternative hydrotherapy. Alistair has asked Charlie Ingham for an update on the search for a new hydrotherapy pool venue.



ACTION 40 and ACTION 39 Hospital Best Practice Idea Sharing

Sean said sharing best practice is ongoing between all the hospitals. They will keep us updated. The two hospital case studies have been shared.



ACTION 23Closure of Crook Lane Respite Service

Sean said this action needs to be closed.

Sub Group Update SAFE AND ACCESSIBLE HOMES from Alistair Jeffs





David and Carla made an **easy read report** to share. Alistair said thank you and it looked good.

- We want everyone in Cheshire West to live in a home that is right for them. In the area where they want to live.
- Some homes need adaptations to help people live well. This means changes to make the homes more accessible.
- Homes also need to be affordable.







- Some people need help to live in their home.
 This is called Supported Living.
- Lots of different people work together to find the right homes for people.
- The council is always looking for places to build or adapt homes for people with learning disabilities.
- We have changed the way we get and record information. To help us understand better what homes are needed.
- We need to find homes for 154 people.
- We are working on 19 different projects.
 These are for a mixture of shared houses,
 flats, bungalows and adapted properties.

Most of these projects take months.

But when finished there will be 106 homes.

Alistair said the Council are listening and doing co-production, working with people to hear what they want. They want to do what is right and learn from the past. They truly want everyone involved in decisions and making better services for the future.


The Winsford Drama Group is working on a murder mystery for the summer. We will be helping fundraise for Mind.

Canal Street Advocacy Group

The group decided to have discussions in the mornings. Then something different in the afternoons. They are planning days out, fundraising, and a Railway station visit.

Dorothy said she gave feedback to a Transport webinar.

And there is a Carer's meeting on 13 March.





A man with a learning disability had to go to A&E at 4.30 in the morning. He was in a corridor until that evening before being found a bed. There were no Reasonable Adjustments. He had his annual health check the day before. The health problem was not noticed even though it was visible.



Physiotherapy and hydrotherapy are really important for health.



Helen Walton said Health care is in a horrific state at the moment. She will tell colleagues in A&E about this. Health providers sometimes miss that Reasonable Adjustments are needed.



Alistair said we understand the pressures on staff in the Health Services. But we need to keep reminding people about what is important to us. Helen will report back what they say at a later meeting, maybe in June.



Other items

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Learning Disability Day Services Review

Alistair said people have 12 weeks to have a say before 8 May. No decisions have been made. We want to hear what we can do better.



We need to look at the cost and value for money too. We want to improve things rather than take services away. All 25 day service providers are talking to people and doing workshops to find what is important to people.



Michael Gentle asked what will happen next.

Alistair said there will be a report with all the ideas and feedback. And an easy read version.



We will then work on the ideas that will make the service better. Nothing will change without us talking to service users and staff. Changes will be at least a year away - not this April but maybe by next April. People can keep asking questions about any worries.



We will talk more about the Adult Social Care Strategy and the Day Services Review at the next meeting.



Jo Moss said it was easy to complete the Day Services Review survey and easy read survey.

Jackie Goldstraw said the Council staff listened to the Co-Production Group ideas for the consultation wording and tool kit. It was a great session and great to be included.



Sexual Health Services Survey

Liane Goryl talked about the survey. She has shared easy read documents. They want to make services better and more accessible.

She would like feedback anyway people want to give it. She is happy to visit and talk to groups.

Anyone can contact her to find out more.



Jackie Goldstraw asked will Government plans for the Social Care workforce help us in Cheshire West and Chester. Plans include a new career path and qualification and Apprenticeship scheme. Lots of local organisations are finding it difficult to get enough social care staff. Roger Fenton said it is difficult to get social work staff too.



Alistair said Vivo only have 18 vacancies now.

They had 40 vacancies before. They have been working with other providers and going to job fairs and promoting social care careers.



Dorothy Jump said not having enough staff can make other staff overworked and stressed.

And it has a big effect on the people they look after.



Charlotte Walton said the council is working hard to get the right staff and give them the right skills. The Health and Social care workforce have 24 people working on Apprenticeships and Degrees at the moment.

plan to do this for the next meeting.



Adult Social Care Self Assessment

Cheshire West and Chester Council are having a CQC Quality Assurance visit. CQC want to check we are providing good support for people to live well and safely.



The Council want to hear what people think of their services. There is going to be a workshop for Partnership Board members to give feedback.

Jackie Goldstraw asked Sean Donnelly about plans for annual health checks for autistic people. Sean said it was still a pilot project. It is not planned for 2023 or 2024.

No organisation has funding to run this scheme for Cheshire West. Jackie said she has shared documents from the pilot project with Speak Up Speak Out from Macclesfield. They want to set up a similar scheme.
