1.	Welcome and Introductions – Charlotte Walton	
	Apologies were received	
2.	Actions from Previous Meeting – Steven Arnold	
	• Carers charter went out for comments before the 8 th of December.	
	 Steve will give further updates on Commissioning team restructure. 	
	• Links and papers were all sent on the 1 st of December.	
	John if the November meeting was quorate with Carer attendance. Steve explained a couple	
	of organisation representatives also have dual role as carers.	

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	Action: Yolanda requested any persons with a dual role to let her know if they are happy to	YB
	be noted for their organisation and as a carer before the next meeting.	
3.	Adult Social Care Strategy Consultation – Charlotte Walton	
	Charlotte noted that all links and information were sent out by Steve to the group regarding	
	the Enabling Great lives Our ASC Strategy consultation.	
	This is intended to be an overarching strategy and brings into one vision the outcomes from	
	the Future of Adult Social Care commission and previous engagement and co-production	
	activities.	
	We would really encourage and value your feedback about the strategy as it touches on all	
	areas that have been highlighted as being important to people within the Borough.	
	Could all members please give feedback via the various consultation channels.	
	Due to pre-election period (starting on the 18 th of March and running until the 2nd of May) a	
	lot of face-to-face engagement and promotion has already been done. However, Cheshire	
	West Voluntary Action (CWVA) will continue to carry out co-production and engagement	
	work during this period. and further face-to-face engagement opportunities will be available	
	after 2 nd May.	
	Action: Yolanda to organise a consultation session for carers	YB/CW/SW
	Yolanda will also recirculate the links sent by Steve for the Enabling Great Lives Strategy	YB
	Consultation.	
4.	Young Carers Update – Alan Jones Cheshire Young Carers	
	In the last few months, we ran our Christmas programme for the Young Carers which due to	
	the Christmas break ran into January.	
	Last half term we had residentials one was at Delamere, to prepare the Young Carers going to	
	Euro Camp and Disneyland Paris, we will be taking 35 young carers from Cheshire West in the	
	Easter holiday.	
	Supporting schools across the borough has increased, a lot of schools are engaging with	
	Cheshire Young Carers around transitioning young carers from Year 6 to Year 7. To help	
	prepare and nurture the young carers as they switch settings from Primary to Secondary.	
	Steven noted a lot of positive feedback about the young carers service from colleagues and	
	Yvonne echoed this giving a great example.	
5.	Adult Carer Groups Update – David Harvey Cheshire West Carer Support Service	
	David shared the update circulated on Wednesday.	
	Updates:	
	 Between October and December, a total of 1714 carers were directly supported 	
	across cheshire west and Chester, this included 544 new carers coming into the	
	service. A monthly average for the Carers Service is around 150/160 new carers per	
	month.	
	• An increasing number of working carers engage with their managers about being a	
	carer and have identified that they would like activities Monday to Friday and to	
	request time off work rather than evenings and weekends.	
	• Telephone helpline numbers for each quarter stay steady – October to December	
	2023 (last quarter) being 783 calls via the telephone helpline. However, seeing a	
	significant increase in online helpline support, last quarter it was 436 people	
	accessing the service via the website or email.	
	• The Respite service now sits back with the Council however some staff in Adult Social	
	Care are still making referrals to the Cheshire West Carer Support Service – could this	
	be raised within social care?	
	 Household Support Fund has been extended for six months. In the last 2.5 years 	
	CWCT have distributed almost £0.25 million to carers in Cheshire West. Working with	
	Cheshire Young Carers to distribute vouchers to 100 young carers across the Borough.	
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	Male Carers Group the Chester group has run for 18 months now. The Northwich	
	group had two false starts but working with Gill from Making Space to create an	
	embryonic Male Carers Group in Northwich meeting at lunchtime.	
	 CWCT survey has just been released – it's a great way to gather Carer feedback – to 	
	provide an update next board meeting.	
	Discussions were raised by Carers regarding graphic representation of the figures, Charlotte	
	agreed an overall year end picture of the service would be great.	
	Action: David to produce a year-end report including graphs, and an overview of carer	
	demographics and services across the borough including identifying potential gaps.	DH
	Steve also acknowledged the great support CWCT has provided to the Carer Assessment Pilot,	
	Household Support funding, Parent Carer support and the Accelerating Reform Fund.	
	Charlotte reiterated applaud their support and noted that a joint Council, CWCT and Young	
	Carers Service review would be beneficial. Highlighting statistics, demographics, reach of	
	services, and current and potential growth of services. This could also include local and	
	national statistics for comparison. Steve noted this could be released for Carers Week –	VD

	Accelerating Reform Fund Update – Steven Arnold	
	Steve updated that working with all 9 Cheshire and Merseyside Local Authorities and	
	Integrated Care Board (ICB) Colleagues an Expression of Interest was submitted to the	
	Department of Health and Social Care for the Accelerating Reform Fund in December 2023.	
	All nine Local Authorities in Cheshire and Merseyside agreed that the funding will focus on	
	Unpaid Carers.	
	There are two area of focus – the first is a digital platform to widen the identification of carers	
	and give support through that platform including digital resources and self-help routes, this will aid in not exacerbating commissioned carer services.	
	Secondly increasing access to Carer Breaks, to give carers a break from the caring role/respite.	
	We have held a couple of workshops and a few people from the Partnership Board and	
	Strategy Group came along so thank you. The importance of safety for the cared for and	
	confidence in the person looking after the cared for person is paramount. So, we are looking	
	at developing Shared Lives – we will be developing another specification around this and will	
	be looking at further inclusion from this group. Knowsley, Wirral, and the whole of Greater	
	Manchester are also focussing on Shard Lives.	
	Charlotte Walton is the Senior Representative Officer for this project and Cheshire West and	
	Chester will be the accountable body for this project.	
	All 22 Local Authorities in the North West have prioritised Carers and 13 of the 22 are	
	focussing on Shared Lives and learning from each other – the Board will be kept updated on	
	this.	
6.	Carers Charter Development	
	Steve updated on the Carers Charter, this Charter is part of the All-Age Carers Action Plan, in	
	January 2023 the Greater Manchester Charter was brought to the Board as a great example.	
	Since then, we have had two workshops and a development day, at the November Board we	
	signed off the Charter (version 6). It now looks very different from the example charter shared	
	back in January 2023! Well done to all.	
	Governance – the Charter has been approved through the ICBs DMT and Cheshire West and	
	Chester (CWaC) Councils DMT governance processes. Next Steps	
	 Develop a webpage for the QR code to link to. 	
	• Carers Partnership Board, ICB (including hospitals), CWaC, CWaC affiliated businesses,	
	Colleges, and Schools to sign up to the Charter.	
	• CWaC will launch this during Carers Week but will have key partners working on this	
	too.	

	This is a Borough wide Charter co-produced by the Partnership Board and is an important	
	achievement.

	John commented whilst this is a great piece of work Cheshire and Merseyside ICB have also	
	released a Carers Charter wont two be confusing? Yolanda noted that the ICB have agreed to	
	promote our charter, and this is Borough Wide whereas the ICB is NHS focused and regional.	
	Sue updated the lack of ICB/NHS representation at meetings and noted that Schools have	
	their own mottos/statements, but the Education Authority has its own plan covering a vast	
	area.	
	The Carers Week theme is "Putting Carers on the Map".	
	a Charter launch would fit the theme nicely this year.	
	Action: Steve and Yolanda to action all of the above	SA/YB
	Action: All Board members asked to support promotion and sign up to the charter	All
7.	Carers Strategy Update – Susan Walsh	All
7.	Sue Walsh updated the group met face to face on the 10 th of January in HQ Chester, with a	
	hybrid option available.	
	The focus of the meeting was Priority One which included an in-depth overview of the Carers	
	Assessment Pilot.	
	Yolanda created and sent a guide to Tom Skerrit regarding the Carer Champion Training	
	available to Hospital staff, to encourage more people to access it online.	
	Action: The Group agreed regular contact from ICB was missing and Steve will action this.	SA
	Next meeting is on the 19 th of March in Wyvern House Winsford, the focus will be Priority	
	Two including Carer Confident Kitemark action, Young Carers Actions and Self-employed	
	Carer identification.	
	We will also look at Carer Engagement promotion Yolanda and Sue have met to discuss the	
	webpage which will be discussed further at the meeting.	
8	Commissioning Team Update – Steven Arnold	
	Steven updated that following a restructure and investment in the Commissioning team some	
	roles were changing.	
	Steven Arnold will move from Commissioning manager for the Prevention Portfolio to	
	Children and Families Commissioning Portfolio Manager.	
	Yolanda Baker will move from the Prevention Portfolio to Children and Families as	
	Commissioning Portfolio Lead.	
	Steve introduces the following colleagues	
	Steve Henshaw who will assume the role of Prevention Commissioning Portfolio Manager –	
	and Victoria Shaw who will continue in the Prevention Portfolio as Commissioning Portfolio	
	Lead	
	The Carer Liaison Officer role has been deleted with the roles and responsibilities being	
	absorbed by the new Commissioning Support Portfolio Officer – who has been appointed and	
	will be in post in April 2024.	
	Steve and Yolanda will support Steve and Victoria with the transfer of responsibilities.	
	Young Carers services will move over to Children and Families with Steven Arnold and Yolanda	
	Baker both of whom will remain members of the Board.	
	The board thanked Steve and Yolanda for their significant contribution to the board and	
	carers services and welcomes Steve and Victoria.	
9.	Any Other Business	
	 Hospital Discharge update – Steven Arnold 	
	The project is up and running with the assistance of Cheshire West Carer Support	
	Service. A dedicated worker links in with the discharge teams, so carers are getting	
	contacted within a target of 6 days of either theirs, or the cared for persons discharge	
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(currently its within 4 days). The funding also targets rural areas where OPAL and	
Neston Youth Centre are working with carers.	
Carers Assessment Pilot update – Victoria Shaw	
The pilot is now entering Phase 2 -the Community Access Team will triage Carer	
Assessment requests and forward them to the Cheshire West Carer Support Service	
where appropriate. They will send completed assessments back to the Community	
Access Team who will follow up on any actions, either closing the assessment as it has	
been fulfilled by the Carer Service or forwarding on to the appropriate team following	
the Carers Services recommendations. Victoria noted the depth and knowledge in the	
Assessments is fantastic, the quality is first rate. And working with the Carers Service,	
with the dedicated workers has been great.	
Carer Support – John Violet	
John raised the issue of lack of carer support when a caring role ends, or a caring role	
continues but the cared for is in residential or a nursing home. He has spoken with	
other carers in the support group who also feel this is an issue.	
David updated that the Cheshire West Support Service will give support for 12	DJ
months following the end of a caring role but recognises carers who care for people in	
nursing or residential settings still as carers.	YB
Dorothy will take this to the Carers Strategy Meeting next week.	
Charlotte agrees this should be taken to the Strategy group and look at what happens	
next, this is a wider focussed piece of work that needs doing.	
John agreed and wanted this on the agenda for the next Partnership Board too.
