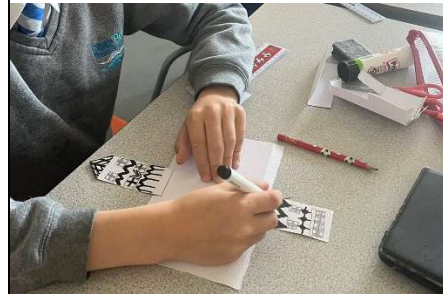
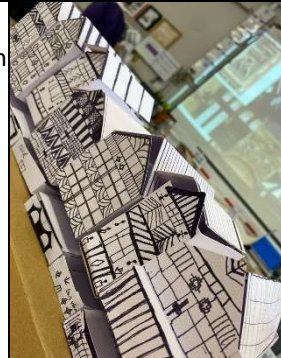

Chester Rows HAZ Revenue Activity: Cultural Programme



The Chester Cultural Consortium was awarded an £80,000 grant from Historic England as part of the Chester High Streets Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) to create and deliver community-led cultural activities on the high street over three years. The programme aimed to test and explore creativity on and around the Rows through engagement projects, micro-commissions, informal skills sharing and events.




The programme aimed to

- engage with communities, visitors and artists through creative activity
- celebrate and reflect the history and stories of Chester Rows and the people who live, work and visit the city
- bring culture into the heart of the city.
- Support, develop and celebrate the growing cultural ecology of the city – with professional, community organisations and individuals.
- ensure that the activity continues to benefit our communities, cultural sector and high street beyond the life of the project.

The Cultural Programme was funded and supported by Historic England in partnership with National Lottery Heritage Fund and Arts Council England; and would be complementary to the main HSHAZ programme. Each area programme was to be developed and delivered by local communities, including those who were active in the cultural offer of the town/city.

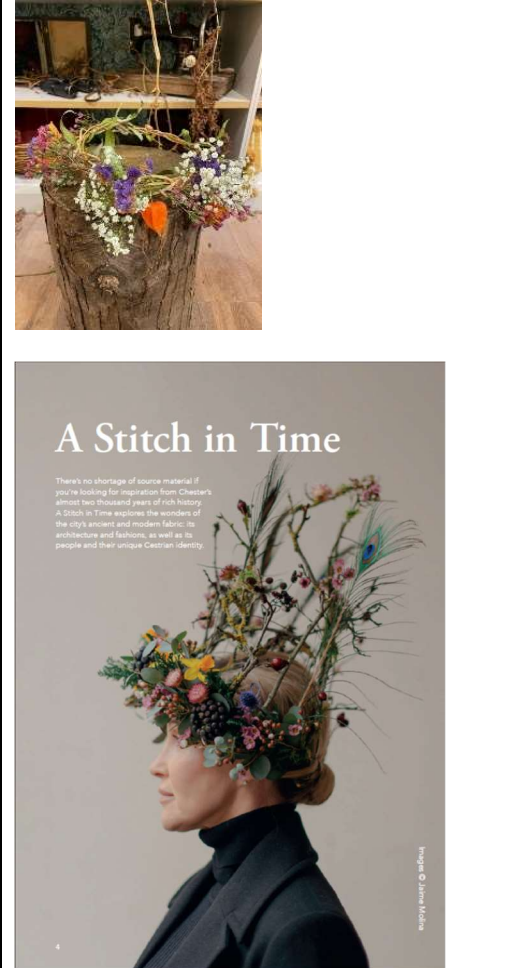



