Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council ("the Council"), being satisfied that the conditions set out in section 129A(3) of the 1980 Act have been met, hereby makes the following Order.

- 1. This Order shall come into force on (2nd April 2012) and may be cited as "The Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council (No. 5 S129A Highways Act 1980 Ellesmere Port Gating) Order 2010.
- 2. The public right of way over the highway described in Schedule 1 to this Order ("the Highway") shall be restricted on all days and at all times.
- 3. The restriction in Article 2 shall not apply to those persons listed in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. The alternative routes for public passage are described in Schedule 3 to this Order.
- 5. The installation, operation and maintenance of a barrier for the purpose of enforcing the restriction provided for in this Order is hereby authorised.
- 6. The barrier referred to in Article 5 shall be maintained and operated by the Area Highways Manager, Chester Area Highways Office, Guilden Sutton Lane, Chester, CH3 7EX.

SCHEDULE 1 – Length of Highway

For the part of the public footpaths of Enfield Road, Beechfield Road, Briarfield Road and Priestfield Road in Ellesmere Port as shown on the plan accompanying this Order. The entire length of alleyway to the side of and behind the following: 1-33 Briarfield Road, 2-46 Beechfield Road, 1a-29 Beechfield Road, 6-34 Priestfield Road and 2-62 Enfield Road in Ellesmere Port as shown on the plan accompanying this Order.

SCHEDULE 2 – Persons Exempt from the Restriction in Article 3

All occupiers of premises adjoining the Highway; Police, Fire and Rescue Services, NHS Trust/Foundation staff, statutory undertakers (providers of gas, electricity, water, or telecommunications services) and Local Authority officers in the exercise of their functions.

SCHEDULE 3 – Alternative Routes

Alternative routes for pedestrians are available on the footways alongside the carriageways of Beechfield Road, Biarfield Road, Priestfield Road and Enfield Road in Ellesmere Port.
