## CHESHIRE WEST AND CHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL (WINDSOR DRIVE AND CASTLE DRIVE, WHITBY) (PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES) ORDER 2025

Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2, 4 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. In this Order the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:
  - "Bus' means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted to carry more than 8 passengers (exclusive of the driver).
  - "Council" means Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council.
  - "Hackney Carriage" has the same meaning as in the Town and Police Clauses Act 1884 and as amended by the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.
  - "Health Care Worker" means any person that can be identified as a GP, Doctor, Registered Nurse and any other nominated medical person working for or on behalf of the NHS.
  - "Motor Vehicle" and "Motorcycle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the 1984 Act.
  - "Private Hire Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Town and Police Clauses Act 1884 and as amended by the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.
  - "Prohibited Times" means the time specified in the Schedule to this Order.
  - "Prohibited Road" means Eddisbury Road, Whitby, Ellesmere Port for the length specified within this Order.
  - "Properties" means the postal addresses specified in the Schedule.
  - "School Street Permit" means a permit issued by the Council to get access to/from the properties specified in the Schedule of this Order.

- "School Transport' a vehicle arranged by the Council for the transport of school children.
- "Support Worker" means any person providing a health and social care service for or on behalf of the Council.
- "Universal Service Provider" has the same meaning as in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011, and reference to the provision of a universal postal service shall be construed in accordance with that Part.
- "Vehicle" means either a motor vehicle or motorcycle
- 2. Save as provided in Article 3 and 4 below, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the prohibited road and during the prohibited hours as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to proceed on the prohibited road if it is being used for the purposes of the Police, Fire and Ambulance in an emergency.
- 4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a motor vehicle to enter or proceed in the prohibited road if the vehicle is being used in connection with any of the following operations:
  - a. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road;
  - b. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said roads, of any sewer or of any main pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in paragraph (1) of the Telecommunication Code contained in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984 as amended.
  - c. any vehicle being used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
  - d. a vehicle displaying a school street permit that has been issued by the Council, to the school street permit holder.
  - e. a vehicle arranged by the Council as school transport for Woodlands Primary and Nursery School to get access to/from the school.
  - f. a vehicle for the delivery and collection of goods and services for/from properties located within the extents of the order.

- g. a vehicle displaying a blue badge, being driven by or carrying a disabled person for access to and from the properties located within the extents of the order.
- h. a vehicle in the service of the Post Office or a universal service provider being used for the delivery and collection of postal packages for/from the properties located within the extents of the order.
- i. a bus and taxi for picking up or dropping off passengers to and from the properties located within the extents of the order.
- j. a vehicle used by a health care worker or support work for the provision of domiciliary care to any of the properties located within the extents of the order.
- k. any vehicle being used for the undertaking of a funeral from any properties located within the extents of the order.
- 5. This Order shall come into operation on the 28<sup>th</sup> March 2025 and may be cited as The Cheshire West Borough Council (Windsor Drive and Castle Drive, Whitby) (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 2025.
